

TLmag 40: The Ideal Home

There are and have been hundreds of publications and media programs entitled ‘ideal home’. What does this expression really mean and where does it come from? TLmag40 will explore this theme of ‘the ideal house’ through the eyes and minds of leading academics, curators, artists, designers, architects and writers. It will question the meaning and intention of the expression and how it applies to contemporary culture. Is it a design or architecture question? A sustainability question? Or is it about the people who make it ‘ideal’? TLmag40 will also look back at historical ‘ideal homes’ and how it defined specific eras of our time and how it might do so for the future.

Chris Dercon is a director of cultural institutions and he has worked with design throughout his career, starting with a project with Robbrecht en Daem on the extension of Museum Boijmans van Beuningen in Rotterdam during the second half of the 90’s. At the same time, he worked with Rem Koolhaas OMA, advising the architects on several cultural infrastructure projects. At Haus der Kunst, in the beginning of the 2000’s, Dercon developed exhibitions of Droog Design, Konstantin Grcic, Herzog de Meuron, Rem Koolhaas, Martin Margiela, Carlo Mollino and Future Beauty: 30 Years of Japanese Fashion at Haus der Kunst in Munich. At Tate Modern, Dercon was the Director of Tate Modern for five-years, during which time he contributed to an important publication, which includes conversations between Dercon and architects Jacques Herzog and Pierre de Meuron, as well as landscape architect Günther Vogt, and interior designer Jasper Morrison. At the Volksbuhne in Berlin, Chris Dercon worked with architect Francis Kéré and graphic designers Manuel Buerger and Till Wiedeck. In Paris, Chris Dercon has worked with Francois Chatillon and Atelier Senzu on the renovation of the Grand Palais in Paris. He is currently working on the future building of the Fondation Cartier with Jean Nouvel, in the summer of 2024, the exhibition Design and Sport, initiated by Dercon and curated by Konstantin Grcic will open at Musée du Luxembourg.




Spazio Nobile Gallery

By opening Spazio Nobile in 2016 in the very lively and cosmopolitan neighbourhood of Place Brugmann in Brussels, art historians Lise Coirier and Gian Giuseppe Simeone have united their passions for design and art history, initiating an erudite dialogue between contemporary applied arts, design and photography. With no boundaries between disciplines, the visual arts interact with the fine arts. Commissioning a collection of unique pieces, limited editions and installations both experimental and artistic, with a particular sensitivity to everything related to nature and minerality, each year the gallery organises five exhibitions and several events in art and heritage venues (Maison Louis Carré, Yvelines, France, arch. Alvar Aalto; Ancienne Nonciature, Grand Sablon; Lempertz (former galerie Leroy Frères), Brussels, etc). Spazio Nobile also takes part in Belgian and international fairs such as Art Brussels, Luxembourg Art Week, Art on Paper, Collectible Design Fair, PAD Paris and PAD London, Design Miami/Basel, Unique Design Shanghai, etc. The gallery is celebrating its 5th anniversary in 2021, and represents around 30 emerging and renowned artists and designers on an international scale, while promoting high-end craftsmanship and the cultures of East and West. Spazio Nobile also curates *TLMag_ True Living of Art & Design*, established by Lise Coirier in 2008; through this bi-annual art and design magazine, available in print and online, the gallery shares its selection and its artistic and cultural commitment to collectible art and design. Spazio Nobile has received the *Homo Faber* label of excellence, and continues exploring its *Glass is Tomorrow* international project. In 2020, Spazio Nobile Gallery opened Spazio Nobile Studiolo, a permanent exhibition space, across from the main gallery which is located at the 'bel étage' of a 1920s house.

I have photographed the Yuri Gagarin Cosmonaut Training Center of Star City in Russia, the Baikonur Cosmodrome in Kazakhstan; the Space Center of the NASA in Cape Canaveral, Florida; the Ariane 5 Space Centre in Guiana; the observatories in the Atacama Desert in Chile; in New Mexico the White Sands National Monument and the Mars simulation in the Red Desert of Utah.

As always in my research, it's the dream part that interests me. So I've been interested in the places where man has been able to dream, but also those where he was woken up, this haze between reality and fiction. The odyssey of space and the exploration of other planets are for me a source of inspiration and reflection. I have then tried to bring up bubbles of memories containing at once my own experience and that of man. The Earth seen from the Moon, where man landed in 1969, was an image that we had not yet seen. But this image has profoundly changed our consciousness of ourselves and our planet. ♦

Pergélisol / Permafrost



Le pergélisol représente environ 15 % de la surface de la Terre. Le sol dégèle lumenement mais sûrement, avec des conséquences dramatiques pour le climat et la Terre. Le pergélisol est une roche gelée en permanence, présente dans les régions et les montagnes alpines qui restent constamment froides au moins deux mois par an. • Permafrost regions occupy roughly 15 percent of the Earth's surface. The ground is thawing slowly but steadily with drastic consequences for the climate and the Earth. Permafrost is permanently frozen soil found in the tundra and mountain and polar regions. It remains constantly frozen for at least two months a year. Emissions of greenhouse gases like carbon dioxide (CO₂) and methane (CH₄). These act like a freezer, storing CO₂ and CH₄ in the permafrost. Depuis 30 ans, Walter Niedermayr a travaillé activement à l'étude de l'impact du changement climatique sur les régions de haute montagne; des zones glaciaires dans lesquelles il a étudié les changements dans les couches de neige et de pergélisol au fil du temps. Ces changements sont plus liés à un lieu qu'à un paysage donné que par la forme de sport elle-même, sans cela elles seraient interchangeables. Nous remarquons que



les personnes diffusent leur points de vue, dans des approches différentes, par exemples processus spécifiques au paysages, à la perception et à la réalité. On peut voir que chaque personne peut créer ses propres références dans l'ambiguïté de la nature. Fécologie, la réalité perceptive-théorique de l'image, la réalité spéculaire. Ainsi manière de regarder le monde, il existe de nombreuses autres façons de voir. On peut parler de la recherche des prémisses références dans ce cadre ambigu. 

PORTRAITS OF TREES, THE BIRTH OF A NEW PHOTOGRAPHY

"In the spring of 1991, I found myself tramping through deep forests on the Olympic Peninsula of Washington State on the American West Coast, shouldering a large 8 x 10. It all started from taking a single image of a tree; I sensed a fleeting presence and instinctively pointed my camera, then what should emerge from the black box but an original photograph, something truly my own. I knew for certain it was a new beginning, without exaggeration, the birth of a new photography. I wasn't just saying this, it was a new experience, a new sensation I was feeling. As if the tree had whispered to me, Look this way. A powerful commanding force had held me there in a trance. From then on until the final photograph, I took pains trying to repeat the experience, but no matter how I wandered about that same overriding power eluded me. Then at the very last, upon shooting my last tree photo, I knew, Enough, it's time to leave the forest."

"I do believe I photographed the forest as a 'force,' something completely different than merely shooting scenery. Or to put it rather strangely, I seem to have been taking portraits of trees. A year later the book was published under the title Quinault, the Native American name for that wooded sanctum."♦





Yoshihiko Ueda was born in 1957 in Hyogo Prefecture. Among his many awards are the Photographic Society of Japan Lifetime Achievement Award, the Tokyo Art Directors Club Grand Prize, and the New York Art Directors Club Photography Award. In 2011 he launched Gallery y6.






If we were to describe my work in two words, they would not be Supper Natural or Super Natural. They would be Honesty and Transparency. Honesty and Transparency when you are in about yourself. But by that I mean that I am not afraid to be honest with myself.

Even my manifested may seem a bit perverted at first glance, such as I ONLY WORK WITH PEOPLE I LIKE. I am not afraid to be transparent with the desire to create something with other people for people. I am not afraid to be transparent with the desire to work with people who like me. I am not afraid to be transparent with the desire to work with people who like me, which is why it must not only for Häberli, but also for the people who like me. It is not only for Häberli and Hämer - and today would probably also stand for Hämer - but also for the people who like me. People that have always shaped, are shaping and will continue to shape my decisions.

Therefore, I appreciated the kind invitation to this Carte Blanche and I am now happy to cover this space with my own words, my own thoughts, my own ideas and clear position of my work. This at a time when honesty and transparency are still important. Honesty should be at the top of the list and in the hope of inspiring others to do the same.

The inspiration for these shapes comes from an old Argentinean game called 'Taba' where the irregular organic metrics lines create various seating possibilities, which is why the sofa has two seats and the sofa faces were deliberately created, as they are well suited to storage space or can be used for working.




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
